## **PROGRAMS**, Tom Fagan

JULY Program: Waking Dreams: ICELAND by Chris Ogden <<u>cameraclubs@chrisogden.com</u>>

We are excited to announce that local pro photographer, **Chris Ogden**, will share about one of his favorite places in the world to lead photo safaris: Iceland. He has travelled extensively from Antarctica to the Arctic (including Spitsbergen, Greenland, and Iceland). Chris says, "there are so many amazing places to see in our world, that I rarely return to the same place twice, let alone many times. Iceland is one of those rare exceptions that keeps calling me back, and back again."

"Iceland" is a misnomer; it should have been named "Greenland." It is a verdant place, the "greens" are fed by tons of water spewing forth from the sky, misty waterfalls, and from huge steam clouds and geysers erupting from the earth's core. But Iceland is also a land of potent contrasts. Parts are intensely barren: one can become enveloped in dark dust storms on unearthly volcanic fields where geologically "new" lava awaits to shred tires of the unwary. You may marvel as greens, purples, and even pinks fill the night skies with Northern lights. One can travel days without seeing another soul or one may

step back in time to explore sod houses built into mountain sides or visit "historic" country churches still in use today. In the same day you may stand behind a huge waterfall; strap on crampons to traverse vast snowfields atop Europe's largest glacier; experience huge icebergs as they migrate from the land into the ocean and then back again onto black sand beaches; feel the earth roar with geysers, fumaroles, and boiling mud pits, and watch up close the antics of the almost ten million puffins! Oh, and don't forget that the "golden hour" stretches to 6 to 8 golden hours

in the summer, when the sun dips below the horizon at 1 AM and pops back up before 3 AM. If this all sounds like a tourist brochure, rest assured that it's the real deal - come see for yourself as Chris Ogden turns these words into stunning images!

Chris Ogden is a full-time professional photographic artist, educator, and workshop leader specializing in fine art, landscape, and commercial photography (http://IcelandRevealed.com). Based in Durham, North Carolina, USA, his photography takes him (and his students) around the world, seeking special moments, in special light.

Staunton, Va – October 18 – 21

Mark Your Calendar – Make Your Reservation

We are in the process of planning for our fall outing. With the board's unanimous approval, we have selected Staunton, VA, which is located in the heart of the Shenandoah Valley and is bordered on the west by the Allegheny Mountains and on the east by the Blue Ridge Mountains. The dates are Sunday, October 18th to Wednesday, October 21st, which the pundits predict to be the height of the leaf peeping season and the reason we wanted to get a room block early.

Staunton is the birthplace of Woodrow Wilson and houses the only presidential library in Virginia, home to the Statler brothers and just down the road is Charlottesville, where we will be able to visit Monticello and the University of Virginia campus.

We have chosen the Quality Inn in Staunton, 1-540-887-0200, and negotiated a nightly rate of \$79.20 + tax. 


## TIME IS NOW TO VISIT THE CAMPBELL HOUSE IN SOUTHERN PINES, SUBMITTED BY JILL MARGESON
