

**Here is a reminder of the upcoming competitions and definitions for 2024:**

- (FEB) Shapes and Patterns – This type of photography refers to the repetition of similar shapes and objects within the photo. May be shapes and patterns in nature or man-made. (3-year limit)

- (APR) Worm's Eye View (get low) – Worm's eye view photography is when a photo is taken from a lower angle in relation to the subject. Since worms live on the ground, their perspective of the world is always looking up. Take a photo looking straight up or from a very low angle. (3-year limit)

- (JUN) Go with the Flow (moving water) – Shoot an image of moving water: a creek, a river, a faucet, a waterfall are just a few examples. May be naturally moving water or man-made. (3-year limit)

- (AUG) Close-Up – Close-up photography is all about shooting smaller subjects in greater detail. It is intended to show greater detail to the viewer. The image does not have to be a true macro. (3-year limit)

- (OCT) Abstract – Abstract photography is defined as a style of photography where the subject in the image is not immediately identifiable or there is no subject at all. By zeroing in on the color, texture, line, shape, geometry, or symmetry of a subject, the photographer warps the perception of the real world and familiar objects. (3-year limit)

- (DEC) Rows of Things – Photograph a number of things arranged in a line. (3-year limit)
